## TOWN MANAGER'S / folde

As we begin the new year, I hope you will join our town team making Dewey Beach the best small beach town in the United States. The town is looking great going into 2024, with multiple projects scheduled for the year.

- All State streets and avenues in Dewey Beach will be repaved starting with Collins Ave to Cullen Street. The work will start in mid-March and should end before May 1st. I'm also attempting to have the town-owned streets of Jersey, Carolina, and Chesapeake paved during this time. It will only be the first two blocks of each of these streets.
- All driveway entrances will be re-marked after the paving is completed. As a reminder, all
  properties are allowed either two 10' or one 20' marked driveway entry.
- To help with storm water management in the town, the Read Ave bayside project should start in mid-January and the relining of the storm water pipes on Dickinson and Collins Ave bayside should start in February. These projects should help mitigate flooding when completed. Work will also begin on the Bayard Ave Pump Station cleaning and resealing the two outfall pipes and correcting a separation in the station wall.
- We will continue to trim back trees and bushes in the town right-of-way to increase safety
  at intersections and clear space for public parking. Also, NO signage can be placed in the
  town's right-of-way. The town will be removing any signs in the right-of-way.
- The new Town Hall/Police Station/Sussex County EMS Station is moving forward. The
  Sussex County Council has voted and approved to provide the town with 1 million dollars
  towards the project to help fund the new Sussex County EMS Station. This will improve
  response times to critical life-threating incidents in Dewey Beach and the surrounding
  coastal communities. We hope to have the new Town Hall project out to bid in late spring
  or early summer, and break ground in the fall of 2024.

Looking forward to a great year!

Many visitors to our area are surprised to know that seals are often seen here during the winter months. Colonies of 50-75 seals have been documented here Delaware, returning each winter from Canada. Not only do they travel here for the slightly warmer waters and variety of fish and shellfish, but the latest evidence shows that they may be mating, and birthing pups right here in Delaware waters. We all share the responsibility of keeping our winter seal population safe and healthy during their "vacation" to Dewey and surrounding areas.

There are three types of seals native to the Delaware coast, including Harbor Seals, Gray Seals, and Harp Seals.

Harbor Seals are approximately 6 feet in length and can weigh in at over 200 pounds. They are blue-gray in color, and are often seen on land.


Harp Seals range between 5 and 6 feet long and can weigh up to 300 pounds. They enjoy small fish while visiting here in Delaware before making their way to arctic waters during the summer.

The largest of the three species, the Gray Seal, can grow up to 10 feet long and weigh 800 pounds. As their name suggests, adults are gray in color, but like the Harp Seal, pups are a fluffy white for the first three weeks of their lives.



### If you see a seal on the beach, please first contact <u>MERR Institute</u> by calling or texting (302)228-5029.

- Stay at least 150 feet from the seal, and encourage others to do the same. Seals are on the beach to either rest, avoid a predator (sharks), or because they are sick or hurt.
   Approaching a seal will likely scare it back into the water that it was avoiding for a reason!
- Seals are protected by federal law. It is illegal to harass, feed, or touch any seal.
- Dewey Beach is a popular place for visitors and residents to exercise their dogs off-leash. It is always a good idea to scan the area prior to letting your dog off-leash to ensure the safety of your pet, and wildlife.
- As cute as a seal may be, they will defend themselves and potentially bite if threatened.
   Seals also carry various diseases that are transmissible to humans and other animals.

It is MERR's commitment to contribute to the preservation of these species through research and rescue efforts, and to foster greater understanding and appreciation of these species and their habitat through education and enhanced public awareness. MERR Institute, Inc. is authorized by National Marine Fisheries Service and the State of Delaware to be the official stranding respondents for the Marine Mammals and Sea Turtles of Delaware.



# It's a Win for The Mewey Mos






We encourage the public to participate and voice their opinion at any of our Town Council or committee meetings.
