# TOWN MANAGER'S / folde

Glad to see May has finally arrived. The Town is set, we have hired our summer lifeguards, seasonal police officers, and our parking and dog ambassadors. We could use a couple more parking ambassadors (salary at \$18.00 an hour with flexible working hours). Apply <a href="here">here</a> if interested! Many thanks to our Dewey Team staff for the hard work getting the town ready for the summer!

Here's the latest in what you need to know:

- DelDOT informed the town on April 25th that paving in the Town of Dewey Beach will NOT take place this spring. The new date for paving is after October 1st. This is great news!
- Lifeguards will begin patrol Saturday of Memorial Day Weekend at 10am.
- The Town Hall Front Office will be open on the weekends starting May 18th. Friday from 8am to 6pm, Saturday from 9am to 3pm, and Sundays from 10am to 2pm.
- The Dewey in Bloom planter boxes will be installed around town starting on May 2nd and 3rd with flowers being planted in the boxes on the 4th. Great job by all DIB volunteers.
- The Town has identified several "Moped Parking" spots on streets near RT 1 and the beach dune crossings. These moped parking spaces are "test spots" for the summer. If they get little to no use they will not be placed after the re-paving project in the fall.
- Paid parking starts May 15th, get your permits now!
- All parking zones in Town are now designated as zone 4012 for easier parking and payments through the Park Mobile app.
- The Arts & Fun Festival is Saturday May 11th sponsored by the Dewey Beach Business
   Partnership. It will take place on Dickinson Street Bayside in the Rusty Rudder Parking Lot.
- A reminder, state law prohibits the use of marijuana in public and by anyone under the age of 21 years old. The town will be enforcing this state law and making arrests when necessary.
- Nothing can be installed in the town's right-of-way with out the town's permission. This
  includes all types of signage, trees, bushes, flowers, and any type of
  landscaping. The only exception is a US mailbox.

Lastly, I'd like to thank Mario Giovannini from Bellevue Street for his continued dedication to keep Dewey Beach looking beautiful. You will see Mario out daily on the streets in Dewey keeping them clean. THANK YOU!

#### **BAY BEACH**

Buoy lines at the bay beach have been repositioned with the goal of increasing the swimming area and protecting bathers from boats and jet skis. This has become a high traffic area for water recreation activities. Boaters should take note of these new buoy lines and keep plenty of space between their vessel and the buoys.



#### **BONFIRES**

Bonfire booking is now available online! Avoid the line at Town Hall and book whenever is convenient for you. Be sure to follow all clean-up instructions failure to do so will result in a fine. We expect this system to result in more bonfire bookings. We encourage you to reserve your desired location early!



#### **PARKING**

In order to meet our public safety and staffing needs, parking fees have increased this year. Free parking hours have also been amended to Mondays only from 5 - 11pm. #### SPECIAL EVENTS

Weddings, picnics, bonfires and gatherings, Dewey is where memories are made. We require event permits to help prevent overbooking of space. If you see event setup in progress, be considerate in allowing some space for the group.

#### QUIET PLEASE

While amplified music is not permitted, everyone can enjoy their favorite tunes on personal-size speakers. Be mindful that those nearby may be in need of some peace and just the sound of the waves!

Keep volume low, or use headphones.

#### **TENTS & CANOPIES**

When setting up your tents, umbrellas, chairs and blankets, we like to say "take the space you need, but leave what you can!" There's plenty of beach for all to enjoy, but be mindful that many families are staying at vacation homes or hotels on the same block, and therefore sharing a beach entrance. Some may have mobility issues, or young children, and need to set up close to their beach entrance. While canopy tents and multiple umbrellas are permitted, consider only taking the space you need. You might just be making beach access easier for someone who truly needs it!

Be sure your sun shades and umbrellas are <u>secure</u>.



# So You Want To Be A De Mey Dog

### Most Importantly...



Dewey Dog owners always make sure to clean up after their pet. We provide pickup bags at each beach entrance, and trash cans on each side of the dune. Protect the health and safety of others, and our environment, and dispose of messes appropriately.



Well-behaved, trained dogs may enjoy the beach off-leash, but must remain under their owner's control. If your dog does not respond to recall or commands, use a leash.



We love and respect all dogs, and understand some are more reactive than others. Know your dogs limits and avoid busy areas if your dog is easily stressed. Use a short lead and other safety gear if needed. No matter the dog, every owner should know how to prevent, and manage an <u>altercation</u>.



Every dog wants to be a Dewey Dog! If your pup is ready to live the dream and experience the beach this summer, we're here to let you in on the secrets that will have everyone thinking "now that dog is a local!" After all, Dewey Dogs know the rules, the culture, and how to navigate the town while keeping themselves and others safe and happy. When you're here, you're family, and our four-legged friends are no exception!



With a town <u>license</u>, from the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend through the Sunday following Labor Day, dogs may be on the beach before 9:30a and after 5:30p. Outside of these dates, dogs can enjoy the beach anytime.



Many shops and eateries with outside seating are kind enough to welcome well-behaved dogs. Be aware these locations are often busy. Keep your dog under your control. Never bring an aggressive dog to a restaurant or shop.



Some dogs just want to enjoy a game of fetch with their owner, or a swim in the ocean. Don't assume that all dogs want to meet yours! Ask fellow owners about their dogs before approaching. Share the beach, and allow everyone space.


